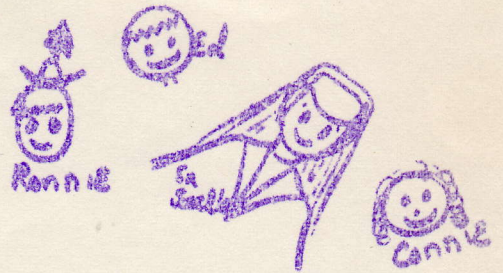



I don't feel so powerful anymore.

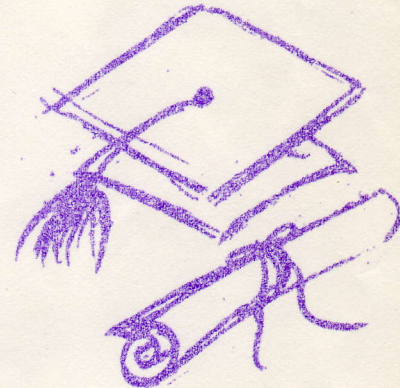

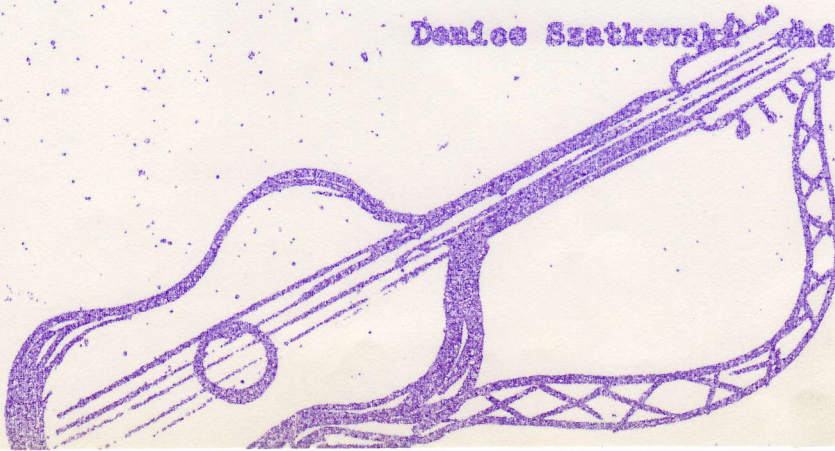
## OUR DAY OF RECOLLECTION
